XIMPORTANT NOTICE

Plants in Personal Baggage

If you fail to submit an import declaration or bring in plants illegally,

you will be subject to penalties.

◆ Please be sure to visit the plant quarantine counter before the customs inspection.

Please note the following points regarding plants brought into Japan in your personal baggage:

- 1. A plant declaration is required on the Customs Declaration (Declaration of Accompanied Articles and Unaccompanied Articles.
- 2. <u>Seedlings and seeds, cut flowers, vegetables, fruit, beans and rice, etc.</u> must be accompanied by an phytosanitary certificate issued by the government of the exporting country.
 - 3. Plants which are prohibited from being brought in will be disposed of.
 - ◆ Inspection takes time to record passport and boarding pass information during import inspection procedures.

If you bring in items or plants subject to import bans illegally, they will be disposed of in accordance with the Plant Protection Act and you may be punished by imprisonment with work not more than 3 years or a fine not more than three million yen (for a legal person, up to 50 million yen).
